



## **2011 USTA Mississippi Super Senior Championships October 7-9, 2011—Greenwood, Mississippi**

### **Tournament Information**

The 2011 USTA Mississippi Super Senior Championships is a competition among the teams in Super Senior Men's and Women's 3.0, 3.5, and 4.0 divisions. The teams will come to compete for the state title and opportunity to represent Mississippi at the Southern Sectional Championships.

Greenwood is a first-time host for the USTA Mississippi Super Senior Championships and will also host in 2012. In this event over 30 teams with more than 250 players will play an excess of 100 matches.

### **Tournament Sites**

All sites are available for practice according to individual facility policies until 7:30am each day of the tournament. Hard-court surface and soft-court for particular division(s) will be used for the event. The tournament committee reserves the right to use different sites and or surfaces due to inclement weather or other unforeseen circumstances.

## Cancellation Policy

Should inclement weather or other circumstances prevent the completion of tournament play at the State Championships, and the Tournament Committee has not cancelled the event, these tiebreak procedures may be used to declare a winner in each group and a champion and finalist in each level. If the Tournament Committee determines that there was a lack of "equal opportunity" for all teams in the level due to the schedule of play, the Tournament Committee will place all teams in a drawing to determine the champion and finalist in each level. (For instance, in a five team round robin, one team may be in first place at the time of cancellation with two matches played, while other teams in the round robin have fewer matches played. This example would not provide "equal opportunity" for all teams the round robin and would not be used to determine the round robin group winner).

If any team (s) in a round robin flight is mathematically out of contention at the time of championship cancellation it will be excluded from the drawing.

- Matches will be the best of 2 sets regular scoring with a match tiebreak (first to 10 by 2) used in lieu of a third set. When a set reaches 6 games all a set tiebreak (first to 7 by 2) will be used to determine the set. The Coman format will be used in all tiebreaks.
- A fifteen minute default time and point penalty system for lateness will be in effect. Please review the **point penalty system**. The referee is responsible for issuing any penalties.
- Line-ups on scorecards can only be changed through substitution in the event of injury, illness, no-show, or personal emergency of a player prior to the start of the individual match. In the event of an unknown default, the opposing team may adjust its lineup. Submitted line-ups may **NOT** be changed due to inclement weather.
- The tournament committee reserves the right to alter format, scoring, surface, site location, and scheduling as it deems necessary.
- Players must have a current USTA membership. Captains are responsible for insuring current membership.
- Players may participate on more than one team during the Super Senior championship play, but no scheduling considerations will be made. Captains are responsible for insuring players are aware of this regulation.
